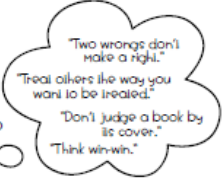

# THEME

the moral, or lesson learned, in a story

## ask yourself:

1. Was an important life lesson taught?
2. What did the main character(s) learn?
3. How did the characters grow or change?



### THEME IS

- a message or lesson the author wants the reader to know or learn.
- often inferred.
- universal, applies to everyone.
- expressed in a sentence/statement.



### THEME IS NOT

- usually stated directly in the text.
- specific or unique to the story.
- a one worded topic.

## TYPES OF SENTENCES

### INTERROGATIVE

asks a question



Ex. Where are we going?

### DECLARATIVE

tells a statement



Ex. It is sunny outside.

### IMPERATIVE

gives a command



Ex. Come here please.  
Stop that!

### EXCLAMATORY

shows excitement



Ex. That was fantastic!

If the equation is

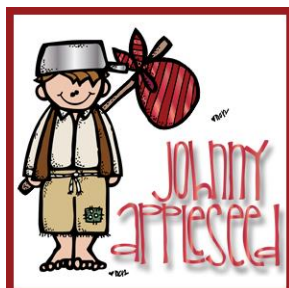
## TRUE,
