<u>pedometer</u> – n. a device that measures the distance a person travels by walking.

<u>podiatrist</u> – n. a doctor who treats injuries and diseases of the foot. Donald is seeing a podiatrist for the treatment of the infection in his foot.

<u>tripod</u> – n. a support or stand for a camera or telescope that has three legs. Dad put the video camera on a tripod to record the band concert.

counter-, contra- opposite, against

Prefix

<u>counterfeit</u> – n. something that is made to look like an exact copy of something else in order to trick people. The criminal carried counterfeit hundred-dollar bills.

<u>counterpart</u> – n. someone or something that has the same job or purpose as another. The actress filmed a scene with her male counterpart.

<u>counteract</u> – v. act against something; to cause something to have less of an effect or no effect at all. She took Tylenol before her immunization to counteract the pain from the shot.

<u>contradict</u> – v. to say the opposite of something; to deny the truth about something; to deny or disagree with what is being said by someone; to not agree with something in a way that shows or suggests that it is wrong. The quarterback wanted to contradict his critical coach and perform well despite low expectations.

<u>contrary</u> – n. an opposite or different fact, event, or situation. I expected the test to be easy, but the contrary was true; it was unbelievably hard!
